## Pray the sacred Labyrinth and the blessed Creation Trail

The Trinity Campus and Meadow are open for all to enjoy. Our neighbors and friends are welcome anytime to pray the Labyrinth and the Creation Trail. You'll find a laminated guide with the Creation Trail's 14 locations in the Welcome Box by the Church driveway entrance. You are also always welcome to get your hands dirty and to help us till and tend the Trinity Garden.



### What is the Labyrinth?

All are welcome to experience this prayerful tool. The labyrinth is not a maze in that it never cuts you off or frustrates you. Simply enter (see the entrance above) and follow the path at your own pace to the center. As you do so, you can release all your worries and concerns—give them up to God. When you reach the center, called the illumination, you will be open to how God is calling you, guiding you. Then as you depart the same way you entered, you are now one with all of God's Creation. It's that simple, yet powerful and life-changing. Now you can incorporate the labyrinth into your prayer life. May God bless and keep you today and always.

### What is the Creation Trail?

*Rogare* in Latin means 'to ask.' Rogationtide is a festival primarily focusing on the planting season when we ask God's blessing for an abundant harvest. On Rogation Sunday we asked God's blessing on our new Creation Trail through the sweetest prayers that were written by our youth. The trail of 14 stations takes you from the Front Door of the Church along stops through the Memory Garden, then into the Meadow for the final seven stations.
