Come to see the freshened kitchen, the new Food Pantry, our newly located library, and the Youth Room with a ping-pong table! Visit the Sunday School classrooms—our precious Atriums for our two Catechesis of the Good Shepherd classes, the Middle School Class Room, the new High School Classroom, the Music Room, and the Art Room.

Get a cup of coffee or some Famous Amos iced-tea and peruse the Parish Hall for Trinity information. You'll receive a *Way of Love* (see page 5) wallet card to help you remember the seven practices to strengthen your commitment to follow Jesus. You'll be asked to fill out forms to update your contact information, sacramental records, and interests. All this will be used to update our database, to create our next parish directory, and to connect you to your ministry calling. Trinity t-shirts, including Blessing of the Animals, will be available for sale. You will learn more about opportunities to support Operation Reclamation, which helps to pay for our much-needed windows and other campus improvements.

We are so grateful for the pretty flowers from the garden that have adorned our altar this summer and for the fresh produce that we share through our Food Pantry. **Other Food Pantry current requests:** granola bars, breakfast bars, cereal, soup, chili, baked beans, macaroni & cheese, instant potatoes, stuffing mix, canned spaghetti sauce, pasta, crystal light (any sugar-free drinks), snacks (graham crackers, popcorn, Cheese-its, jerky meats, chips, nuts, sugar-free jello/pudding, etc.), any cooking items (oil, sugar, sugar-substitute, spices, salad dressing, condiments, etc.)

Support Operation Reclamation: Buy a Window and help with needed repairs

We're almost there! Through your generous gifts since we began Operation Reclamation, we have been able to repair both our church air conditioning and lightning protection systems. (These two projects cost over \$27,000.) Last month we were able to

order 47 new windows for the Parish House by placing a 50% deposit, which was an additional \$25,000. We still need another \$25,000 before install, which is planned for January 2022. The windows are the originals when the Parish



House was build in the 1960s. They are in dire disrepair and some are literally falling out. Your generous gift of \$1000 will buy one window, but you may give any amount you wish to help restore our ministry building. *Operation Reclamation* will eventually become *Operation Maintain-It*, once we've taken care of these deferred projects!

A pastoral word from our Presiding Bishop Michael Curry on the 20th anniversary of September 11, 2001

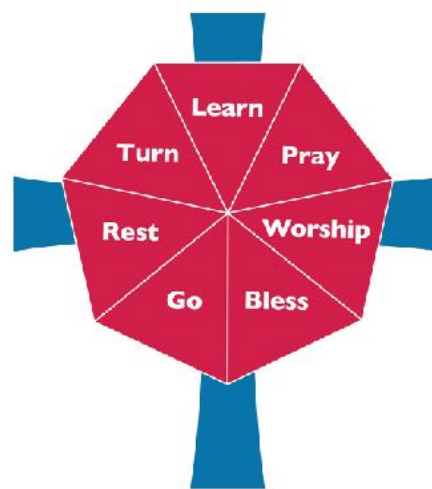
As followers of Jesus, and with our siblings in other faith traditions, we place great value on the act of remembrance. As we reflect on the solemn anniversary of Sept. 11, 2001, we remember many loved ones lost and first responders who put their lives at risk, modeling the sacrificial love of Jesus. ...

I also want us to pause and remember the days that followed these tragic events. ... [P]eople came together. We were praying, grieving, and also working together. ... [W]e knew with immediacy and vulnerability that we need God, and we need each other.

Memories of that tender cooperation ... serve as guiding lights for the present. Amidst the ongoing pandemic and natural disasters ... we are called to become the Beloved Community whose way of life is the way of Jesus and his way of love.

How do you walk the labyrinth? You pray it!

Many of you have known parishioner Roger Vance for a long time, but I wonder how many of you realize what an extraordinary artist he is! Roger, using a lawn mower as his ‘paint brush’ has created for us and for our community a most inviting labyrinth in our Meadow. All are welcome to experience this prayerful tool. The labyrinth is not a maze in that it never cuts you off or frustrates you. Simply enter (see the entrance above) and follow the path at your own pace to the center. As you do so,

you can release all your worries and concerns—give them up to God. When you reach the center, called the illumination, you will be open to how God is calling you, guiding you.



Then as you depart the same way you entered, you are now one with all of God’s Creation. It’s that simple, yet powerful and life-changing. Now you can incorporate the labyrinth into your prayer life.
